



What You Need to Know About Camp Fire Summer Day Camp 2020

Health & Safety

Drop Off – Children will be met at their vehicle by a Camp Fire Staff member who will perform a brief health screening (temperature check, physical observation for coughing, etc.). Drop off is from 7:30-9 am.

Cleaning & Sanitation – Please read the Addendum to the Parent Handbook for all the details. Your child will be provided individual art materials and supplies. Any shared items such as books, toys and games will be rotated out, cleaned and sanitized after each use. Handwashing will be monitored and frequent. We will be adhering to all CDC Health and Sanitation guidelines.

Masks – Children will be required to wear masks while inside. The type of mask you choose to send your child with (cloth, disposable, etc.) is up to you, but no child will be admitted to the program if they are not wearing a mask at drop off. If a mask is soiled during the day, we will have a small number of replacements.

Health Screening Questions – If you answer “yes” to any of the questions on the screening form your child will not be able to attend in accordance with CDC. Youth who have a fever over 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, cough, difficulty breathing, or any two symptoms will not be permitted to return to program until ALL of these parameters have been met: No fever for at least 72 hours without the use of medicine that reduces fevers, other symptoms have improved, and 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.

Notifications - Families will be notified in the event of COVID-19 exposure at camp in accordance with CDC recommendations and guidelines. Specific names of youth, families or staff will not be shared.

Sickness at Camp – If a child becomes ill at camp, parents will be called, and the child will have a safe, secure location away from the group to rest while they wait for a parent to pick them up.

Registration

Enrollment – All enrollments are for the full summer session of 4 weeks. There will not be any part time or partial summer offerings this year. There will not be any prorating for missed days or holidays.

Availability – There are extremely limited spaces for camp this summer. 50 children will be accepted into Parker County Day Camp and 20 children will be accepted into Diamond Hill Station Day Camp.

Payments – Once your child/children are successfully enrolled, you will be responsible for the registration fees and first week’s payment. You may pay for the summer in-full or pay by the week with our auto-billing option.

Cancellation Policy - Your deposit is non-refundable. A request for a refund of your additional payments can be made, in writing, up to 14 days prior to the first day of your registered 4-week session that begins June 29, 2020. No refund will be made if you cancel after this time frame. If Camp Fire cancels or cannot accept your child/children into camp, you may request a refund or credit for any unused paid funds to your account."

Program Details

Visitors – In order to minimize interactions and possible exposure, as well as to ease exposure tracking, only staff and registered youth will be allowed at camp. Current health mandates do not allow any visitors or special guests.

Daily Activities – Camp will run from 7:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m. Monday – Friday. Drop off is from 7:30 – 9 a.m. Pick up is from 4 – 5:30 p.m. If you arrive outside of these times, please call the site to let them know. We will continue all our standard activities, except for any off-site travel/swimming. Each day will still consist of robust selection of interactive, fun activities that maintain social distancing. PLUS! We have some exciting activities to boost the reading, social and emotional skills of your child.

Grouping – Children will be grouped into multi-age cohorts of 10 children keeping family groups together. This will be their “team” for the summer with the same counselor/group leader

Field Trips - Field trips will not occur.

Meals & Snacks – Please send your child with a daily lunch in an insulated lunch bag or kit, and a water bottle. We will be providing daily snacks.

Outdoor Time – We will be spending a lot of time outdoors. Please be sure to send your child wearing sunscreen daily and consider sending a hat or an extra set of clothes if needed. While outside, children will not wear masks and will be reminded to follow proper social distancing guidelines. We will wash our hands before and after outside time.
